LPH WELCOMES NEW PHARMACY DIRECTOR

Langdon Prairie Health welcomed its new Director of Pharmacy to the hospital in early July. Catherine Taylor recently moved to Langdon from Florida with her husband and three-year-old son.

"My husband and I love the Langdon community and are looking forward to raising our son here," said Taylor, a 2013 graduate of South Florida's Nova Southeastern University College of Pharmacy.

Hospital Pharmacy is an incredibly rewarding area within healthcare and there is a lot of room for growth here. Everyone I have met is friendly and happy to be at LPH"

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One of Taylor's responsibilities will be to serve on the Discharge Planning Committee along with Chief Nursing Officer Jamie Nienhuis; other committee members are nurses, the on-call provider, physical therapist and social worker.

Together the group will review each patient's status; if all the committee members agree on the next step in the patient's care, whether that's being discharged home or to another facility for further care, Taylor will have the opportunity to meet with the patient to provide a complete medication review with them and their caregiver.

"I am looking forward to being able to work with all the different departments here at the hospital and getting to know everyone better," said Taylor.

In addition to patient safety and education, Taylor is also excited about the opportunity to expand the services offered by the Pharmacy Department.

Taylor expects that preparing and administering cancer medications will be one of the services that the department will be able to offer with the future addition of a pharmacy hood, which is used to prepare sterile products such as medications.

Taylor also has plans to earn a Tobacco Cessation Drug Therapy Certification with the North Dakota Board of Pharmacy.

"I would love to help patients quit tobacco and improve their quality of life with the immediate and long-term benefits that tobacco cessation provides," she said.

Taylor enjoys hiking and traveling with her family, including visiting national parks, and said she looks forward to adding skiing to her list of outdoor hobbies this winter.

Many people experience pain as a result of injuries, diseases, or conditions; pain management, which is the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of pain, helps people with sudden pain feel better and improve their quality of life. LPH's non-surgical, personalized treatment plans help patients relieve their pain, restore their mobility and regain a healthier, happier quality of life.

Whether it's pain that lasts a short time and then goes away with the healing process – acute pain – or it's chronic pain that lasts for months or years, LPH manages pain in many different ways, which may include medicines, physical therapy or therapies such as massage or exercise – or a combination of these – to help people feel better.

LPH has partnered with Holistic Pain Management (HPM) since 2021 to provide personalized chronic pain solutions for patients; HPM is a national leader in providing holistic pain management to rural America.

Langdon Prairie Health's non-surgical pain management can help with a variety of conditions, including:

- Achilles tendonitis
- Carpal tunnel syndrome
- Diabetic peripheral neuropathy
- Fibromyalgia
- Headaches, including migraines and tension headaches
- Heel spurs
- Joint pain (e.g., knee, hip, elbow or shoulder)
- Osteoarthritis
- Sciatica
- Sports injuries

OB-GYN Care

Returns to Langdome Prairie Health

You asked, and Langdon Prairie Health answered: After several years without regular OB-GYN care in the immediate area, Dr. Tana Setness Hoefs is joining LPH as a visiting OB-GYN specialist.

Initially, she plans to work at LPH one full day each month, with the potential to increase the number of days if there's enough demand.

A resident of Grand Forks and employed with Altru Hospital, Dr. Setness Hoefs already has a significant number of patients from Langdon and the surrounding areas who have been traveling to see her at Altru for several years, and she says that she is looking forward to saving them the four-hour round-trip drive.

Dr. Setness Hoefs has been practicing in Grand Forks for 20 years, and said that during that time, three hospitals in the surrounding area have stopped delivering babies.

"So now patients are looking at a two-hour drive to have their babies," she said. "Or when you need an appointment every single week at the end of your pregnancy, four hours for an OB appointment is a lot – I get the hardship that patients have to go through when they have to travel for care."

Dr. Setness Hoefs pointed out that having OB-GYN care in the Langdon area is good not only for the patients themselves, but also for the community: "I think any time a person doesn't have to take four hours off of work to travel to an appointment, that's a good thing – instead, they can be productive for their employers, which is a benefit to the community."

In addition, Dr. Setness Hoefs noted that it's always an advantage to keep healthcare dollars in the community, which helps keep hospital and clinic doors open.

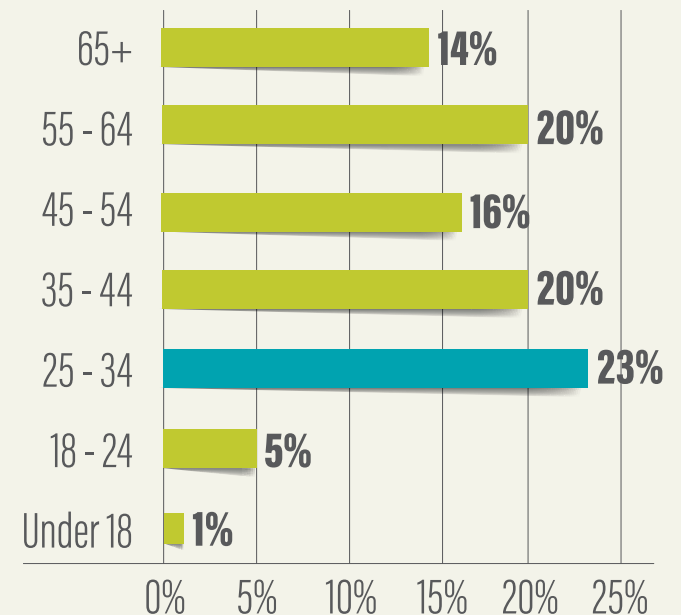
We’ve identified and prioritized three focus areas to improve upon during the next three years:



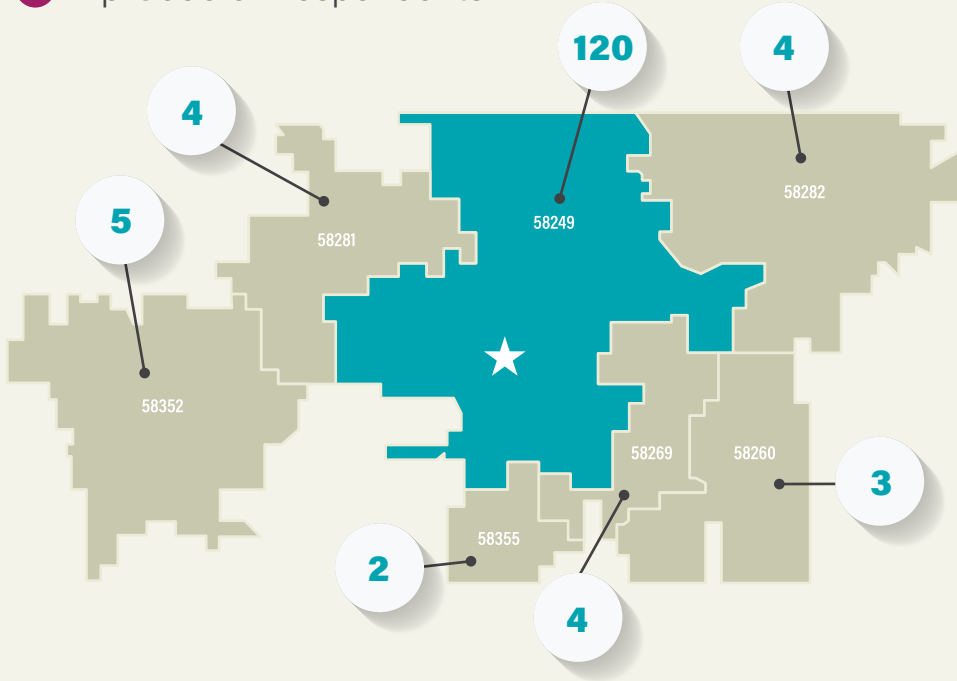
LPH will be developing an implementation plan to address these areas, and will make that plan available to the community.

Zip Code of Respondents

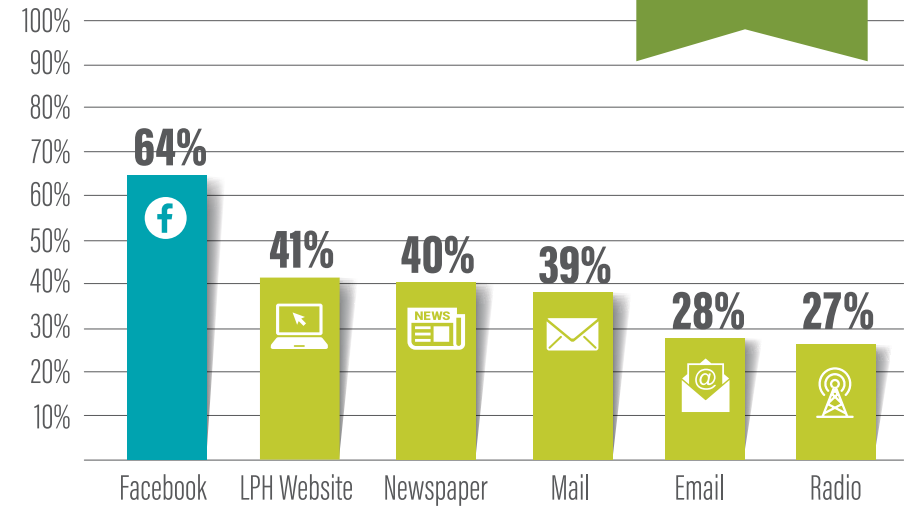

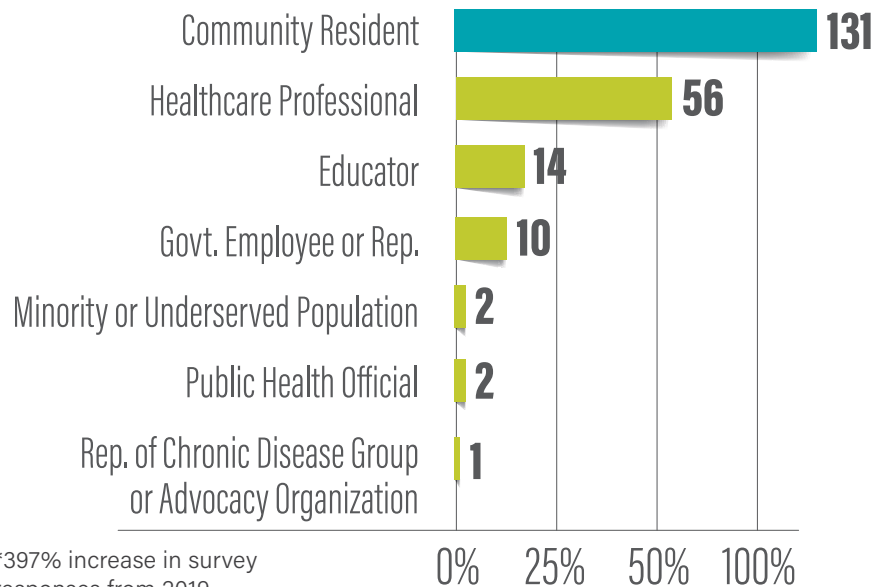

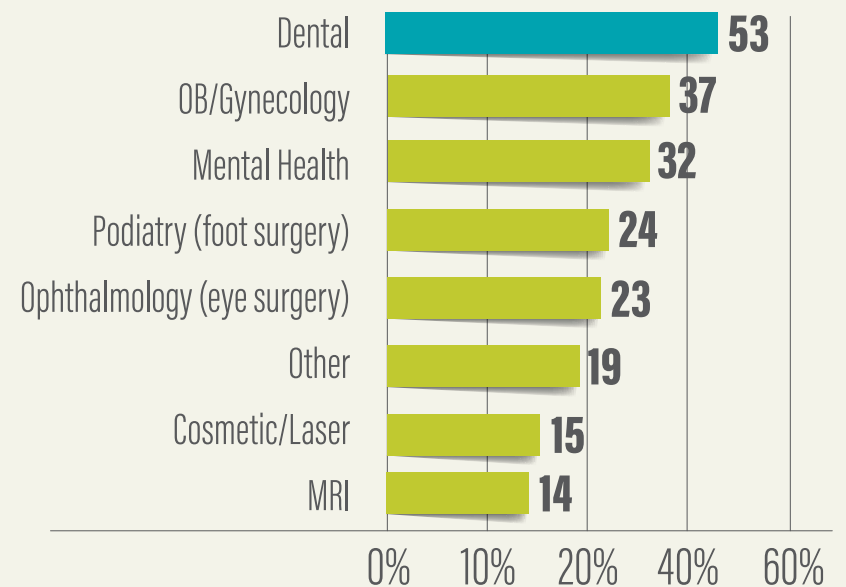
Respondent Groups
